- 1. Comment on the subject matter of any four (04) of the following referring them to their contexts:
 - a) 'But just when we get out to sea we are attacked –
 And pirates take the ship. Fate's will be done,
 And I was finished, though I scarcely had begun."
 - b) "It was my eagerness to restore your sister to your keeping that brought all this on my head, and a lot more besides."
 - c) 'I am delighted too in every way that she's found to be your daughter."
 - d) 'Even that King of Kings who once built a highway across the great deep who gave his legions a path to tread among the waves and taught them to march on foot over the briny gulfs and with his chargers trampled scornfully upon the ocean's roar. ..'
 - e) 'Foolish Alexis, why should you run from a countyman like me? There have been gods who made the woods their home. And so did Paris, Prince of Troy. Pallas can stay inside the citadels she builds for towns.'
 - f) 'Have no fear.

 The kingdom prospers, and good fortune smiles

 Upon the royal house. More cause that you

 Should smile upon good fortune.'

- g) "What can I do in Rome? I never learnt how
 To lie. IF a book is bad I cannot puff it, or bother
 To ask around for a copy;"

- ii. 'Terence's play *The Girl from Andros*, is a fine manipulation of 'mistaken identity'. Do you agree with this statement? Justify your answer.
- 4. 'Both Hippolytus and Phaedra turn out to be both the prey and the hunter(ress).' Comment on this statement with reference to the themes of Seneca's *Phaedra*.

- 5. 'The aim of Lucretius in his On the Nature of the Universe is to banish the fears that hinder the peace of mind in people.' Assess how Lucretius achieves this target.
- 6. Examine how Virgil's *Eclogues* break away from idyllic Bucolic poetry and portray the realistic harsh and uncomfortable lives of the Shepard.

- 7. 'Juvenal's satire 3 is a manifestation of his contempt towards the contemporary socio-cultural circumstances of Rome'. Comment on this statement with reference to Juvenal's *Sixteen Satires*.
- 8. Critically evaluate how Tacitus praised the Roman Emperors while criticizing them at the same time without incurring their wrath in his *Annuls of Imperial Rome*.
