ENGLISH SYLLADUS

(Effective from 1991)

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION :

The Examination in English for the General Degree of Bachelor of Arts shall consist of three papers of three hours each:

ENGLISH I (EG 1) : Language and Drama

ENGLISH II (EG 2) : Poetry

ENGLISH III (EG 3): The Novel

Candidates will be given a wide choice of questions but will be expected to have a basic knowledge of all texts and topics set for study. Passages from texts will be set for comment though details of context will not be required. Candidates' essays should show ability to read texts closely with sensitive attention to nuances of style and meaning. A detailed knowledge of background and of critical works on the texts will not be required, but candidates will undoubtedly profit from reading other literature of the same periods and forms as the set texts, and from a selective reading of articles and books of criticism.
